Sufism touched the lives of most ordinary Muslim for centuries through the Sufi orders, mystical teachings, music, and rituals.

"Mystics and Saints in Islam" is taught by University of Illinois Prof. Valerie Hoffman, an Islamic studies expert with extensive research experience among Sufis in Egypt.
