Framing Hate and Terror: Violence Classification in the United States with Corina Simonelli

A multi-methods project using survey experiments and content analysis to understand how Americans and the American media conceptualize and differentiate terrorist attacks and hate crimes.

Breeding Contempt: Racial Assessments of Police Violence with Nicole Yadon

This project explores how white respondents react to stories about police-involved shootings and their subsequent opinions towards police. Using an original survey experiment, we expose respondents to a news story involving police officers shooting and killing either a black man or a dog, followed by various newly developed measures of feelings towards police.
