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SUPPLEMENT NONINTERVIEW IMPUTATION

During this imputation, all supplement noninterviews, nonmatches, and supplement "interviews" in which there is not enough supplement information to justify the creation of a supplement record will be statistically matched to interviewed supplement records based on the matching variables shown in Attachment I. As shown in the attachment, the match "groups" are defined by the current work status of the respondent, or in the case of married couples, by the combination of work statuses of both the husband and wife. The use of current detailed occupation codes as a matching variable will be maximized for all workers. In addition, every attempt will be made to impute married couples jointly, at least in cases where one or both spouses are nonworkers. In cases where both spouses are workers, they will be matched separately, in order to obtain the best possible occupational match. Married couples who do not match as a husband-wife will be matched as persons, based on their current work status. On a person's basis, the lowest match level is general enough to ensure a match in all cases.


