Course Description and Requirements

This course will survey art and architecture which represent traditional spiritual beliefs, concepts and practices, primarily in West and Central Africa. Art, dating from the fifth to the late twentieth centuries, of various media and type will be examined in regards to placement, presentation, and use such as shrines, masquerades and rituals. This course also will examine the role and status of the artist, the relevance of art and aesthetics, and the influence of Islam and Christianity on art within the context of spirituality in specific ethnic communities. Two exams and The course will be presented one term paper are required. in a lecture format, however, class discussions are expected. Therefore, there will be assigned readings from publications in the University library system and on reserve in the fine arts library. A course syllabus will include lecture topics, bibliography, a glossary and checklist of represented works.
