(Black Life and History in Michigan

This course will survey the experiences of Blacks in the State of Michigan, emphasizing trends, events and activities significant for their local, statewide, national and/or international significance. Topics covered will include slavery in Michigan, Black migration and geographical distribution, the development of Black churches, organizations and community institutions, Black leaders, Black business developments, occupational opportunities and the development of Black urban workers, Black professionals, the activities of Black women, health care, housing patterns and changes in education, social and economic status from the 19th through the 20th centuries.

Special attention will be given to Black involvement in politics and civil rights activities from the 1800's to the present and how suburbanization and technological change have affected Blacks since World War II.
