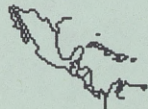

AAS458 Section 3 (three credit hours). Meets with Linguistics 492. Creole languages spoken in the Caribbean are among the off-spring of colonization's inter-breeding of African and European cultures. We will explore creolization from a historical and comparative perspective; examine its socio-cultural expressions in religion, music, and literature; and address questions of identities by looking at Creole speakers' attitudes toward race and toward the African and European components of their languages and cultures..
