


Department of Psychology Diversity Recruitment Weekend

You are invited to apply to attend the **University of Michigan's Department of Psychology Diversity Recruitment Weekend** on October 19-21 2017. The Diversity Recruitment Weekend provides undergraduate students from underrepresented groups from around the country with information about graduate school. It contains workshops, discussions, and individual meetings with faculty and is designed to prepare them for applying to graduate school. You are not required to apply or attend the University of Michigan if you come to the Diversity Recruitment Weekend but you will also receive an intensive overview of the graduate programs in psychology offered at the University of Michigan.

The Recruitment Weekend is FREE and covers cost of travel, accommodations, and meals. The application process is short and no letters of recommendation are required! Students will be notified if their application is accepted. Space is limited so please apply as soon as possible.

Please note that all students are eligible to submit an application including international students, non-US citizens, undocumented and DACAmented students. Also note that diversity here is broadly defined (ethnic, race, gender, income, first-gen, etc.) and we encourage applicants from all backgrounds.
