Protrait dominance:

- 1. An ideal society requires some groups to be on top and others to be on the bottom.

Contrait dominance:

- 3. No one group should dominate in society.
- 4. Groups at the bottom are just as deserving as groups at the top.

Protrait anti-egalitarianism:

- 5. Group equality should not be our primary goal.
- 6. It is unjust to try to make groups equal.

Contrait anti-egalitarianism:

- 7. We should do what we can to equalize conditions for different groups.
- 8. We should work to give all groups an equal chance to succeed.

Note: The con-trait items should be reverse-scored before computing a composite scale mean.
